



ROBERT

Robert Rogers is a native Texan whose work is inspired by Native American art, Asian art, European art, scouting and Indian lore. As a child he lived in Okinawa, France and England and later studied art at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas. He has been greatly influenced by his visits to the great art meccas of Europe and especially by the art of Gustav Klimt and Rene Lalique.

Robert Rogers is a partner in Robert Lance Jewelers store in Lubbock, Texas. For more than 40 years, he has designed and created fine jewelry as an art and as an expression of love for the craft. The highly detailed work in his art reflects his skills as a jeweler and master wax carver. Robert's expression of archetypes in Native American culture is depicted in petroglyphs and pictographs from ancient North American sites, blended with mystical spiritual symbols, braille, Asian art and other icons. His limited edition collection includes two and three-dimensional bronzes, a full line of wearable art and a vibrant palette of contemporary paintings that follow the same mystical style for which he is known.



Robert's forms of art are layered by the actual creation of the piece and his descriptive storyline that develops the feeling and passion of each piece as it is being created. These storylines, written by Robert, accompany many of the individual artworks. The storyline plays as much a part of his art as the actual piece. Reading the storylines while viewing his work creates an experience of emotion and memory of an event or person. Robert calls this the "memory bond" which becomes the catalyst for the relationship to his work. Each person will experience this bond in a different manner

Honoring: Elizabeth G. "Bess" Haley, Ph.D.

Dr. Elizabeth G. "Bess" Haley has a long history with Texas Tech University and TTU System. She served as Dean and Professor of the College of Human Sciences, Interim President, Deputy Chancellor and Associate Vice Chancellor for Institutional Advancement. She was named Dean Emeritus by the Regents and received the Lauro Cavazos Distinguished Service Award from the Texas Tech Alumni Association.

Dr. Haley retired after more than 33 years of service and later returned half time as Special Assistant to the Chancellor to pursue a bold vision for the arts. She works closely with Terri Duncan, Dean Noel Zahler and Institutional Advancement to assist with fundraising for the J.T. & Margaret Talkington College of Visual & Performing Arts.

Bess and Terri have worked closely with the Lubbock Entertainment and Performing Arts Association, the Lubbock Arts Alliance and other arts groups to develop ARTS Lubbock, a group that brings together all the arts organization to pursue national and international recognition for the arts at TTU and in Lubbock. Thanks to the enthusiasm of many, ARTS Lubbock is pursuing a Lubbock Office of Cultural Affairs, new avenues of arts funding and recognition that the arts impact the economy, education, health and wellbeing of our city. An economic impact study of the arts in Lubbock, funded by the Lubbock Economic Development Alliance, is underway.

In past years, Dr. Haley has worked to increase private funding to support academic programs, faculty positions, scholarships, fellowships, facility gifts and other major projects. In 2008, the Lubbock Association of Fundraising Professionals named her Outstanding Fundraising Professional.

Dr. Haley received Distinguished Alumni awards from Louisiana Tech University and Florida State University and an honorary degree from the University of Akron.

A community leader, Haley has served on numerous Lubbock boards including Carillon and Saint Mary of the Plains Hospital. She has received awards for

leadership, including the Lubbock YWCA Woman of Excellence in 1989. Dr. Haley is impressed by the many prestigious artists and outstanding arts organizations in Lubbock and humbled to be recognized by the Lubbock Arts Alliance.

"I cannot call myself an "artist" although I took lessons in piano, ballet and oil painting, and I was a member of the band and various choirs when I was in high school in a small Louisiana town. I plan to pursue painting when I retire!"

There are people that believe that if someone has a dream, they should follow it. Age shouldn't matter. Shannon ("Shan") Fannin has always dreamed of becoming an artist, but temporarily shelved the idea in order to raise a family and work in the corporate world.

Fast forward 26 years later. Shan takes a leap of faith, and rekindles her love of art. With the support of her loved ones, she takes a handful of community college art classes to refresh her knowledge of artistic media. She found that she adored using color and reveled in depicting the human form.

When her husband added a 1961 Ford Thunderbird to the family garage, they began attending local vehicle shows. Shan was attracted to the abstract reflections first, but quickly realized how each owner had a story about the vehicle. She fell in love with the car, motorcycle, and racing culture.

Her paintings have been featured in media within the United States, Greece, Turkey, Brazil, and the United Kingdom. She has had 2 solo exhibitions including Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance 2016. In 2018, she will be traveling to Italy to visit manufacturers Lamborghini, Ferrari, Maserati, Ducati, Alfa Romeo, and Vespa. This will be for reference materials for her upcoming racing, super/hyper vehicle series of paintings. She hopes to have her 3rd solo exhibition with this series at the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance in Monterey, California or during Formula One in Austin, Texas 2019. Her goal is to be one of the finest vehicle artists in the world.


Carranza Puppets


The Carranzas are a husband and wife team. They delight in bringing children's literature to life through the puppetry arts.
